The world for a film pass



A look at the Montreal Film Festival

In a far, far different landnot too far away - is
Montreal. If country life is getting a little too peaceful, you don't want to deal with high winds from Katrina or are worrying about a new high in gas prices, maybe you need a weekend escape. There's a multicultural expe-rience right on your doorstep.

Yup! Six Montreal movie theaters successfully opened their doors on Friday, Aug. 26 for the Montreal Film Festival, and they will stay open through Monday, Sept.

In a well organized fashion, against many odds, World Film Festival Director Serge Losique has proven himself a winner by regaining the competitive film festival status for loyal cinephiles, distributors, film critiques and fans

"A vote of confidence from all international film professionals," assures the 29th year of the Montreal Film Festival, and its future have a fighting chance. Okay... cut. It's a long story. And you can find details about the festi-val's recent troubles on its web site. Suffice it to say: local film fanatics who dream of world travel are free to do so, in short order, at low cost to pocket book, and in a city roughly an hour away.

Just book it across the border to where you can visit Sweden, Norway, Finland, Russia, China, Vietnam, Korea, Japan, Iran, Turkey, Germany, London - name it. In three days, I journeyed to

them all

You'll be greeted along the way by many friendly Canadian hosts who can also guide you along the highway. And once in Montreal, Festival Directories are everywhere. Select from 300 plus films - some old, many premiere features, student films, shorts, documentaries.

Naturally enough, opinions vary among the many talented critics spoken with between screenings: Flick Chick Susan Green from Seven Days, Cinema Studies professor Ana Maria Pavela, free lance journalist and radio producer Ron Stang from Windsor, Ontario, film maker James Wallace, a variety of cinephile from Greece, Sweden, NYC and Boston, and a smiling couple of film distributors from Korea.

My very favorite of the festival is David Tamagi's feature dictorial debut, the outstanding "Paper Moon Affair," which had its world premiere at the 2005 Montreal Film Festival. Extraordinary acting by leads Misa Shimizu and Brendan Fletcher carried the film faithfully to a very plausible and interesting ending. We could easily see "Paper Moon Affair" gain world recognition, very soon. Beautifully written, directed, and edited. Not a frame wasted. In 2000, this artistically exquisite, Japanese influenced movie was conceived by Executive Producer Thomas Fung. Three years ago,



Parker brought together a fabulous team of collaborators - true players - and later filmed in British Columbia. There's great use of location throughout - with crashing seascape, moon viewing, and animals integrated into the story, giving richness and genuine balance to the developing emotions and growth of the lead characters.

This is the best film I've seen in a very long time. Finally, a film that doesn't hit you over the head but instead carries and delights you with each turn and each surprise. After three days of film watching - morning till night - I can easily say "Paper Moon Affair" won my "Hart."


